

COMMANDER OF THE ORDER OF ST. JOHN BY KING CHARLES THE THIRD

Her Excellency Sandra Lady Williams was admitted being Commander of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem on the instructions of His Majesty King Charles III. The investiture took place on October 22nd at the Priory in St. John's Gate, London.

The ceremony was conducted by Prior Stuart Shilson and Chancellor Simon Williams. Others present included His Excellency Sir Rodney Williams, Knight of the Order, Dean Paul Williams.

The motto of the order is "For the faith and in the service of humanity." In response to the welcome, Her Excellency Lady Williams graciously accepted the honour. She said, "Thanks to everyone who had a part to play in bestowing this award on me. I'm very humbled. And hopefully deserving. Two weeks ago, I found myself facing death. In fact, one minute more and I would not be here today. This award is therefore very timely, and my recent near-death experience has made me realize even more that what is important is for us to live a life of service. The Order of St. John has been dedicated to helping mankind. We can't thank you enough for your charitable contribution to global charity. I was fortunate enough to be involved with the work of the St. John Hospice in Antigua, and St. John Ambulance here in the United Kingdom. I pledge to continue to help as much as I can- as long as there is breath in my body."






GAYE HECHME AWARDED BEST CORPORATE CITIZEN




PCOS RETREAT

HIGHLIGHTS ISSUES IN WOMEN'S HEALTH

A retreat on Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS), organised by the Halo Foundation's youth arm (Generation Y), was held recently at Government House. The event aimed to illuminate the complexities of PCOS, providing support, education, and empowerment to women affected by a prevalent, yet frequently misunderstood condition.

The Governor General, His Excellency Sir Rodney Williams, commended the Executive and Members of Halo Gen Y, of which he is proud to serve as Patron, for hosting a health education seminar at Government House. This is the second health-oriented seminar organised by Halo Gen Y, the first being an earlier mental health anti-suicide event which attracted well over one hundred young people in Antigua and Barbuda. Sir Rodney emphasized the importance of understanding one's body to enhance self-care. He encouraged Halo Gen Y to "continue organising such health seminars to complement the efforts of the Ministry of Health and other health institutions on the island", noting that knowledge empowers better personal health care.





HALO FOUNDATION, PROGRESSIVE VISION AND SWISS EMBASSY LAUNCH EYE CARE INITIATIVE

The Halo Foundation, in collaboration with Progressive Vision and funded through the Honorary Consul of Switzerland in Antigua and Barbuda, recently launched an eye care initiative under the slogan "Future Bright with the Gift of Sight." The goal of the project is to provide essential eye care services to underprivileged youth, offering free eye exams and when needed, glasses to improve their vision.

During the first phase of the project, over 65 individuals were provided with free vision care services, including new glasses. This timely initiative will also assist the youth as they are about to return to school and may need assistance with their vision.

Halo Foundation Welcomes New Patronage

Antigua and Barbuda, [July 16, 2024] – The Halo Foundation announced that Their Excellencies Sir Rodney and Lady Williams have graciously accepted the patronage of the newly established Ricardo Barriteau Drue Foundation. The three-day event showcases the remarkable calligraphy works and paintings of Mrs. Zheng Lai Yili, a resident of Antigua for the past 23 years.

The event was attended by students from six primary and secondary schools (some of which were also displaying art created by the pupils), along with various Ministry officials, teachers and parents. Mr. Cuthbert Forbes Jr., Secretary of the ACFA, delivered remarks on behalf of the Association's President, Her Excellency Lady Williams. In his address, Mr. Forbes congratulated Mrs. Zheng on curating the exhibition and commended the launch of her two books: Traditional Flowers of China and Making Home in the Beautiful Islands of Antigua & Barbuda. He encouraged the students to engage with the artwork over the next two days, noting the deep connection between the pieces and the picturesque landscapes of Antigua.











CHINESE LANGUAGE DAY

The Embassy of The People's Republic of China hosted Chinese Language Day on Friday, April 19th, in a vibrant celebration of Mandarin language and culture. The event welcomed teachers, students, and parents from various educational institutions that have incorporated Mandarin into their curriculum, showcasing a commitment to promoting cross-cultural exchange.

Co-hosted by Grace from the Chinese Embassy and Cuthbert Forbes, Secretary of the Antigua & Barbuda China Friendship Association, the event was a collaborative effort aimed at strengthening ties between both nations and fostering mutual appreciation for cultural diversity.

Attendees were treated to a spectacle of traditional Asian performances and delectable cuisine, as they immersed themselves into the rich tapestry of Chinese heritage.

Chinese Language Day holds special significance, having been acknowledged by the United Nations 14 years ago.



Antiguan Delegates Participate in Cultural and Educational Exchange in China

Cuthbert Forbes, Administrative Assistant at Government House, Public Relations Officer of the Halo Foundation, and Secretary of the Antigua Barbuda China Friendship Association, together with Rozanne Emanuel, Administrative Assistant at Government House, recently embarked on a significant journey to China to investigate the development of small commodity markets in developing countries.

At the seminar, Forbes and Emanuel acquired invaluable insights into the expectations of emerging markets and explored innovative strategies by which small island states like Antigua and Barbuda can utilize their natural resources to promote economic development. They visited local businesses and technological centres, thereby enhancing their understanding of potential avenues for capital generation.





Additionally, the delegates engaged deeply with Chinese culture through martial arts training, museum visits, and sampling the local cuisine as part of a comprehensive cultural awareness program. This immersive experience was shared with representatives from eight nations, totalling 45 participants, thereby fostering international collaboration and cross-cultural exchange. The participation of Forbes and Emanuel in this Chinese cultural and educational exchange underscores Antigua and Barbuda's commitment to fostering global partnerships and enhancing bilateral relations. Their enriching journey exemplifies the power of cultural immersion and knowledge sharing in driving sustainable development and promoting mutual understanding among nations.



HUMANITARIANISM IN OUR YOUTHS

Lady Sandra Williams Humanitarian Award 2024

Faith Gibson was recently selected as the Antigua Girls' High School (AGHS) recipient of the Lady Sandra Williams Award for Humanitarianism, during the school's anniversary service.

Her Excellency Lady Williams attended the AGHS for a few years in the '70's, and has introduced the award as a platform to encourage selflessness among young people.

Faith is described as a student who is genuinely helpful to both her peers and the staff. She is a strong advocate for the well-being of her fellow students and has on occasion taken up the mantle of discreetly alerting staff to situations where a student may be in need of assistance or intervention.





Lady Williams Award for Humanitarianism

D' Myca Samuel is the 2024 recipient of the Lady Sandra Williams Award for Humanitarianism. The award, which was presented during the Christ the King Graduation Ceremony earlier this year, is bestowed annually upon a student who exemplifies exceptional leadership through selfless actions.

Her Excellency Lady Williams is a past student at both the Christ the King and the Antigua Girls' High Schools.



HALO CONTINUES SCHOOL TOURS TO BOOST MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS.

Over the past four weeks, the Halo Foundation conducted school tours across Antigua and Barbuda in collaboration with a team of mental health professionals. These tours were largely aimed at increasing mental health awareness while promoting overall wellness, and addressing issues related to youth violence. Launched in October, the initiative marks the debut of "BLUE," a branch of the Halo Foundation focused on human development through mental wellness.

The tours included visits to T.N Kirnon Primary School (Daryl George), Five Islands Primary School (Harriet Warner), Villa Primary School (Dr. Koren Norton), Antigua Girl's High School (Jill Fuller) and Clare Hall Secondary School (Devra Thomas). During each visit, the mental health professionals encouraged positive peer engagement and listening as strategies for managing social anxiety and stress. They also shared practical advice in time management and emotional balance, equipping students with essential skills to effectively

navigate their pre-adolescent and adolescent years.

The primary school sessions gave students and avenue to understand emotional intelligence and how to express themselves effectively. In contrast, the secondary school visits focused on managing stress during examinations and adapting to new environments. President of the Halo Foundation, Her Excellency Lady Williams noted that the timely initiative has been in the making for some time now. She said "in 2017, we became concerned with the nation's incidences of teen suicide and that is now being addressed, as we seek to find ways to surmount challenges surrounding mental health awareness and wellness." The Halo Foundation, which was launched in 2014, is an umbrella charity assisting 35 organizations under the patronage of Their Excellencies, Governor General of Antigua and Barbuda Sir Rodney Williams and Lady Williams.

Heritage Trust and London Museum PARTNER ON RESTORATION PROJECT

The Heritage Trust of Antigua and Barbuda (HTAB) and the London Museum Docklands have joined efforts to progress the historical Government House Restoration Project. The aim of this collaboration is to explore the synergies between the West Indies and the United Kingdom, and their story of "sugar and the enslaved", as the narrative progresses "from slavery to emancipation to independence".

Sir David Harrison said that he was pleased to be involved with the Government House project. He stressed that not only would the physical property be revamped, but the training of Antiguans and Barbudans in conservation and restoration, and the creation of meaningful jobs, were high on the agenda.

At both the cocktail party and an exclusive donor's appreciation

dinner held two days earlier, guests were given the opportunity to tour Government House, inclusive of the upstairs chambers, and to view old paintings of royalty. Also on exhibit was the Parham Prince painting collection donated by Nancy Underhills, interesting pieces of crockery from the 1700's unearthed from the grounds of Government House, and other important relics — including antique pots, aged rum kegs and fragile water jars.

The first phase of "Operation Restoration" was funded by the Calvin Ayre Foundation, the Mill Reef Club and Sir David Harrison, with the second phase scheduled to commence in April 2024.




COMMONWEALTH AI CERTIFICATION

The Halo Foundation recently announced that five team members have completed 21 online Al courses from The Commonwealth e-learning platform. This training equips the Halo Team with skills to streamline data, manage workloads, and securely back up information.

In a recent Avanade AI Readiness Report, it was deduced that "92% [of 3,000 respondents] believe they must shift to an Al-first operating model in the next 12 months to stay competitive". Additionally, "63% agree that employees will need new skills for generative AI".

Lady Sandra Williams, President of Halo, states: "We must take every opportunity to help our young people to learn and develop. Al training is essential for Antigua's youth to face the future — and therefore, as AI technology advances, staying informed is crucial. It is extremely encouraging that the Commonwealth Secretariat has provided these resources to member states at no cost."

The Commonwealth AI Consortium (CAIC) offers various AI education initiatives, including the Commonwealth Al Academy with Intel, the Make-A-Thon program with Open Weaver, the Commonwealth Al Incubator, and Simplilearn certification opportunities. Other courses on offer include Digital Readiness for Public Sector Leaders, Introduction to Responsible AI Skills and Commonwealth Climate Finance Essentials.


